Well done to everyone involved.

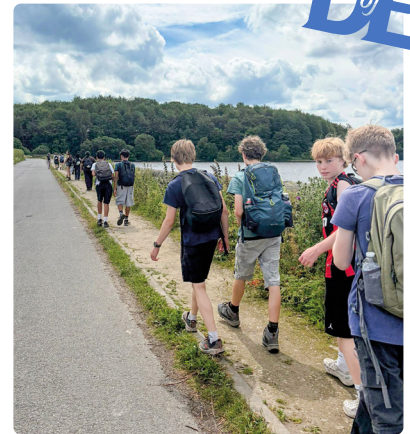

UNIVERSITY OF LEEDS ECO-CHAMPIONS

We recently welcomed a group of students from the University of Leeds who visited us to run a new sustainability workshop.

The university students led discussions about endangered animals from around the world, explaining the reasons why some species are at risk, including habitat loss, pollution and climate change. Our pupils were particularly enthusiastic when exploring how small changes in daily life (*such as reducing waste, recycling more carefully and making environmentally friendly choices*) can help to protect wildlife and preserve natural habitats.

Peace education is key to helping us build the knowledge and motivation needed to take action in protecting biodiversity and caring for the planet.

The session also gave pupils a fantastic opportunity to work alongside university students, asking questions and gaining insight into future study and careers linked to sustainability and conservation. The visitors were impressed by the thoughtful ideas shared by our pupils and their enthusiasm for making a difference.

Overall, the workshop was a great success and left everyone feeling inspired, with pupils demonstrating a sense of responsibility for the world around them.

How to stay cool when the weather is HOT

Parts of the UK have been dealing with some very hot weather recently.

You might be heading somewhere nice in the sunshine, but remember it's important to look after yourself when the temperatures goes up.

Sun cream

The sun is great for us, it feeds our plants, keeps us warm, and the vitamin D the sun produces is good for us too. However, the sun can be harmful to our skin, and too much exposure to the sun can burn us or make us unwell.

Luckily, we have sunscreen! If you're going out in the sun, you're meant to

follow the instructions on the bottle, and apply it regularly. You can never really wear 'too much' sunscreen.

Remember that if you're going in water, you need to reapply as soon as you're out, and make sure you always look at the instructions on the bottle. You can always ask an adult for help.

Keeping yourself cool

One of the main things to remember is to keep hydrated.

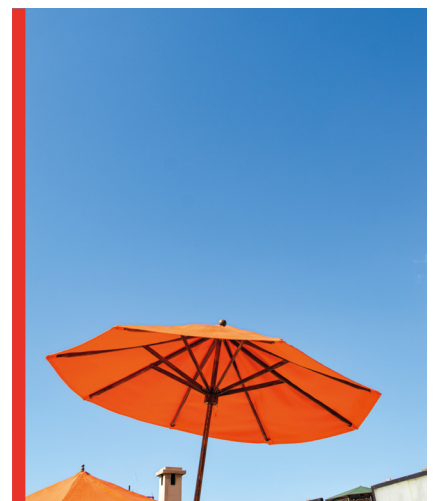
When it gets hot, your body will sweat more, and you'll become dehydrated more quickly. Remember

to snack on things like fruit to keep your energy up. Sunscreen is great for protecting your skin, but another great step is to cover up, to reduce how exposed to the sun you are.

Make sure it's light, comfortable, loose-fitting clothing, and to complete the look, get a hat on your head to protect yourself from the sun even more.

Keeping your pets cool

If you're feeling warm, your furry friends probably are as well. Remember to make sure your pet has access to shade and fresh drinking water.



Tips...

- Stay hydrated
- Stay in the shade
- Avoid going outside at the hottest time of the day (around midday)
- Wear sunscreen
- Wear light and loose fitting clothing
